

### Faithful in a Contrary World: There's a Price on Your Head!

Holy Scripture: Mark 3:1-6

### Introduction

- **Overview:** Examining the tension between doing right and facing opposition, as demonstrated by Jesus' actions on the Sabbath.
- Scripture: Hebrews 13:5 God's enduring presence amidst our stand for righteousness.

# The Cost of Doing Good (Mark 3:1-5)

- The Setting: The synagogue on the Sabbath, a day central to Jewish worship and community life.
  - Genesis 2:2-3 (Sabbath's origin): And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. <sup>3</sup> And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.
  - Exodus 31:16-17 (Sabbath as a covenant sign): <sup>16</sup> Wherefore the children of Israel shall keep the sabbath, to observe the sabbath throughout their generations, for a perpetual covenant. <sup>17</sup> It is a sign between me and the children of Israel for ever: for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested, and was refreshed.
- **Jesus' Confrontation with Legalism:** Highlighting the Pharisees' criticisms and Jesus' teachings on the true purpose of the Sabbath.
  - Mark 2:27-28 <sup>27</sup> And he said unto them, The sabbath was made for man, and not man for the sabbath: <sup>28</sup> Therefore the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath.
- **Healing on the Sabbath:** Jesus heals a man with a withered hand, challenging traditional interpretations and prioritizing mercy over tradition.
  - Galatians 6:9-10 (encouragement in doing good): <sup>9</sup> And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. <sup>10</sup> As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.

## The Reaction to Righteousness (Mark 3:6)

- **The Conspiracy:** The unlikely alliance of Pharisees and Herodians against Jesus, illustrating the threat Jesus posed to both religious and political authorities.
- The Cost of Discipleship: Reflecting on the implications of following Jesus, embracing the cross, and facing worldly opposition.
  - Luke 14:27 <sup>27</sup> And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple.
  - John 15:18 <sup>18</sup> If the world hate you, ye know that it hated me before it hated you.

### The Price of Faithfulness

- Our Value in God's Kingdom: Understanding that opposition for righteousness is a testament to our alignment with God's values.
  - Matthew 5:10-12 <sup>10</sup> Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
    - <sup>11</sup> Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.
    - <sup>12</sup> Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.
  - 1 Peter 2:9 <sup>9</sup> But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:
- The Reward of Perseverance: Encouragement to endure, focusing on the eternal rewards that await those who stand firm in their faith.
  - James 1:12 <sup>12</sup> Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.
  - 2 Timothy 4:7-8 <sup>7</sup> I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: <sup>8</sup> Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

### Conclusion

- A Call to Courageous Faithfulness: Inspired by examples of faith through history, we are reminded that standing for truth often means standing against the world.
- Inspiration from Historical Figures:
  - Martin Luther: Resolute stand for truth during the Reformation.
  - Dietrich Bonhoeffer: Sacrifice in opposing Nazi tyranny.
  - Jan Hus: Boldness in preaching reform before the Reformation.
  - Polycarp: Unwavering faith in the early Christian church.
- Contemporary Example:
  - John MacArthur: Fidelity to biblical truth in modern ministry.
- Assurance of Jesus' Presence: The promise of Jesus' continual presence gives us strength to face opposition.
  - Matthew 28:20 <sup>20</sup> Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.
